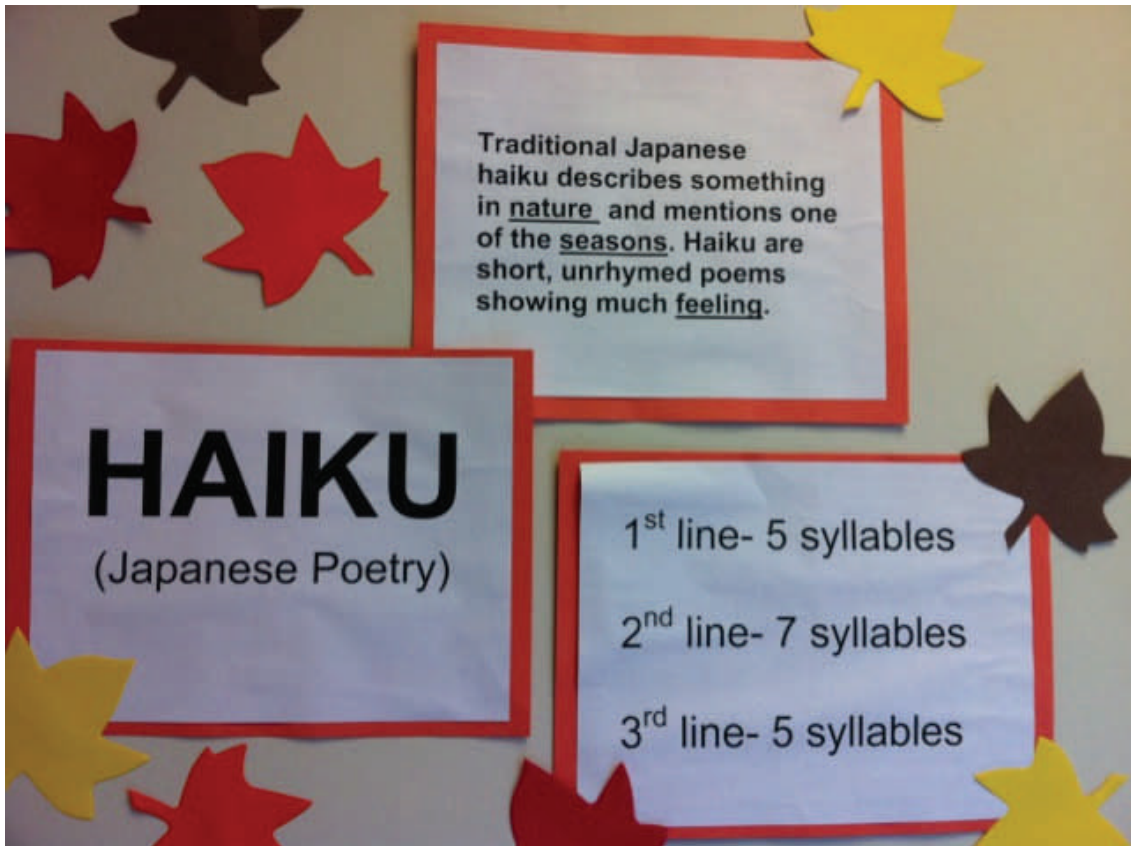

5th Grade Angle Art

Students in the fifth grade have been working on geometry since school started. One way students practiced vocabulary and using the protractor was to create angle art. Initially, teachers provided specific parameters (how many acute and obtuse angles, and how many straight lines). Students practiced by creating art and then used the Document Camera to share, pointing out their different angles.

For the six framed art pieces produced for the Gladstone Education Foundation Auction students chose how many of each angle they wanted to incorporate, and could produce whatever style of angle art they fancied. Adults and students helped decide which three pieces from each class would be included in the auction. In Mrs. Durkee's classroom, the art chosen was created by Jacob Knutson, Lanie Sticka, and Aleisha Kerr, and in Mrs. Fox's classroom, the art chosen was created by Andrew Pulsipher, Gavin Fields, and Madison Diggs. There were many creative and beautiful creations from which to choose.

Backpack Buddy Program

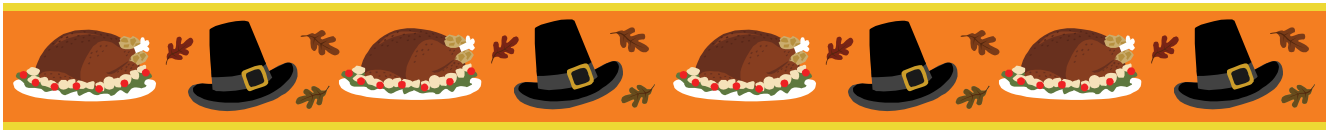



Some exciting things have happened to the PE program at JWE! First of all, we are the proud owners of a brand new wood gym floor courtesy of the district bond. This floor is absolutely beautiful. In order to keep this gym floor looking new and lasting for many years to come, I'm requiring that all students wear the proper shoes (tennis shoes) when participating in PE. If the student happens to forget their shoes, I have extra tennis shoes they can wear for that day. I sure could use your help to make sure that your child is wearing the proper shoes for PE. Second, we won a \$20,000 dollar gift from Family Care (an insurance company) last year to enhance our nutrition at JWE. Starting in November, we will be introducing a new fruit and or vegetable to the students at JWE. The purpose of this concept is to expose our students to some healthy foods that they might not have tried before. We are also planning a parent and child cooking class in the upcoming months. If you are interested please let me know so I can start a list.

As September flew by we were able to go over PE expectations, practice our warm up routine and get ready for the Jog-A-Thon. October was a great month in PE. The effort the students put towards the Jog-A-Thon was outstanding. This year I saw every student (1st – 5th) reach our Jog-A-Thon goal. The goal was for everyone to jog at least 1 mile in 20 minutes. I'm so proud of their solid effort and their determination in completing the goal! During the second half of October, we started our Football Unit. The football unit is an exciting unit for both the girls and boys. The skills that we working on during this unit are:

1. Fitness – anaerobic, quick short burst of sprints
2. Throwing – learning how to throw a football properly (throwing spirals)
3. Catching – using our hands and not our body to catch the ball
4. Listening and Following Directions – listening to the direction and then performing it

In November we'll be starting our Soccer unit.

HOMEWORK PHILOSOPHY

The John Wetten staff has been working to reevaluate their homework practices with the goal of better preparing our students for the future. The primary purpose of homework at John Wetten Elementary School is to practice and extend the skills that students have learned in class. Homework will be given when teachers believe it is essential to the student's learning. Typically these assignments are short in duration and skill specific. The amount of homework given is not an indicator of rigor. More homework does not equal smarter students. We believe the most important element of homework in elementary school is reading. Reading is a skill necessary in all school subjects and a worthwhile independent activity.

We know that students are at different levels in their learning, so we will provide homework that is appropriate for where each student is. We appreciate your support of your child's homework and ask that you provide a protected time and space after school hours for your child to accomplish their homework. We understand that family life can be very busy and often demanding. Please let us know if you have circumstances that prevent your child from accomplishing their homework.



Our goal is to work together with you to provide an excellent education for your child, both during and after school. If you have any questions about JWE's homework philosophy, please contact the school principal, Wendy Wilson, or if you have specific questions about your child's homework, please contact your child's teacher.

John Wetten Elementary School staff have agreed upon the following homework guidelines when structuring and assigning homework.

We believe....

- *Reading across all grade levels is essential.*
- *Homework is targeted and purposeful based on material already taught in class.*
- *Homework is practice, reinforcement and extensions of classroom content.*
- *Homework is differentiated based on age, developmental capacity and academic needs.*
- *Homework should not require extra resources or excessive adult support in order for the student to be successful, but can provide opportunities for peer and adult involvement.*
- *Homework should have flexible schedules to support a family's busy schedule, as well as not requiring students to work over extended breaks.*
- *Homework encourages student accountability and responsibility.*

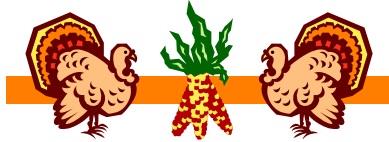

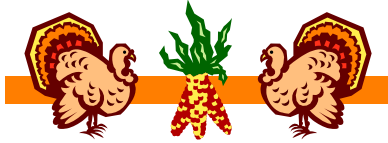
